REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

As we have done over the last two years, we would like to integrate the Church bell ringing fully into the Remembrance Day Service. The bells will commence ringing at 9:30 am and ring half muffled through to 10:05 when they will fall silent while the Church organ plays for five minutes. At 10:10 the tenor bell will toll slowly as each of the 22 names on our War Memorial in the Church are read out. The twenty third toll will be dedicated this year to those who risk their lives in peacetime as well as during war, in particular, the Police Service, the RNLI and the Fire and Rescue Service. Last year just before Remembrance Sunday on the 2nd November four firefighters lost their lives in the fire at Atherstone on Stour. We will remember them. Their names were Ian Reid, Ashley Stephens, John Averis and Darren Yates-Bradley. The final toll of the bell will be dedicated to those remembered in the hearts and minds of those listening.
